



PROVISIONAL WORLD PARLIAMENT

18 COMMITTEES of the PROVISIONAL WORLD PARLIAMENT -July 2026-

Since the conclusion of the 16th Session of the Provisional World Parliament (PWP) in Pondicherry in December 2025, the five members of the Presidium meet weekly to manage and implement the agreements approved there, including, **the Activation of the Commissions, Committees, Colleges and Administrations** (hereinafter Commissions): 18 in total, plus 11 territorial delegations.

All the Basic Documents were drafted with the specific contents and tasks of each Commission.

Summary of the current situation of the 18 Commissions (July 2026)

1. Permanent Secretariat

The Secretariat was established as the permanent administrative and operational body of the PWP. Its function is to guarantee the continuity, legality, transparency, and operational effectiveness of the PWP in accordance with the laws passed (WLA75, WLA77).

2. Press Room

Its primary task is to generate internal PWP and external news, and to disseminate the Earth Constitution and related news that reflects the PWP's perspective on the global situation.

This Commission meets frequently to promptly issue any news as it arises.

3. Digital Strategy Commission

Its main objective is the creation of the PWP Information System with the necessary subsystems: a new PWP website (currently in the testing phase), a database, and a publication support system that will allow the implementation of information generated by the Press Room.

This Commission meets frequently to expedite the launch of the website.

4. Emergency Earth Rescue Administration

This Administration, established under Article 17.03.10 of the Earth Constitution, is mandated to design, coordinate, and promote planetary-scale restoration and regeneration strategies, addressing ecological degradation, social harm, and systemic collapse resulting from unsustainable economic, political, and technological systems.

This Administration meets on the last Friday of each month.

5. World Limits and Elections Administration (WBEA)

The 1,000 global districts, each with approximately 8,000,000 inhabitants, are being demarcated, and the most important cities are being identified to serve as headquarters for the precursor electoral districts.

This Administration meets frequently to finalize the demarcation of the 1,000 districts.

6. Legislative Review Commission

Objectives:

To complete the compilation of proposed amendments to the World Constitution and complementary legislation that will be submitted for approval at the Fifth Constituent Assembly.

The revision of the Constitution is virtually completed in its first phase, with more than 150 amendments having been proposed. In a second phase, all delegates will be able to propose their own amendments.

This Commission has been meeting weekly for over a year to complete its review of the amendments proposed by its members.

7. Ratification Commission

Objectives:

1. Promote awareness of the World Constitution by disseminating it among individuals, organizations and nations, inviting them to adhere to or ratify it by signing the Manifesto.

2. To propose initiatives for a Conference of Nations to be convened based on Article 109 of the UN Charter so that our proposal for its replacement by the Earth Constitution, establishing a World Parliament, can be debated.

3. Publicize the Constitution to the BRICS countries to gain their support. Letters have been sent to the founding countries and preliminary contacts are underway.

This Commission meets twice a month: every first and third Tuesday.

8. Peace and Disarmament Commission

Objectives:

To promote and achieve world peace and security, progressive demilitarization, non-violence, and the elimination of wars in accordance with Article 1 of the World Constitution of the Earth Federation.

Active participation in the 4th World March for Peace and Non-Violence, which will take place over two weeks (from September 21 to October 4, 2026) simultaneously in hundreds of cities on the five continents.

The work program of this Commission includes the development of a global disarmament plan regulation and the compilation of relevant international legislation, as well as the study of specific legal cases related to the possession of weapons of mass destruction.

This Commission meets every third Thursday of each month.

9. World College of Judges

It acts as a provisional planetary advisory body ensuring the interpretation, safeguarding and preliminary application of the principles of the Earth Constitution during the Interim Stage.

Missions of the College of Judges:

To defend the civil and human rights protected in the World Constitution and its laws by guaranteeing constitutional legality and justice in all areas, especially the protection of fundamental rights and the legal order of International Law in relation to the Earth Constitution and its legislation.

To provide authoritative legal interpretations when requested by the Presidium, the Permanent Secretariat, the Provisional World Parliament, and also to provide such interpretations when requested by the Administrations, Commissions, and Committees established by the Earth Constitution.

Similarly, the College of Judges may provide authoritative legal interpretations to affiliated and collaborating organizations of the Earth Federation that so request.

This Commission meets without fixed periodic dates.

10. College of Human Beings for Justice

It functions as an institution for global civic and ethical recognition and training, focused on world peace and global citizen oversight against nuclear weapons and weapons of mass destruction.

It also acts as an advisory and supervisory body, complementing formal judicial structures.

This Commission meets when required.

11. World Council on Population and Migration

This Council has the following main functions: to design demographic balance policies that respect reproductive rights; to help countries with birth rate imbalances: populations that are either too old or too young; and to coordinate plans for the redistribution of the workforce between regions.

This Commission is pending of holding its meetings.

12. Commission to Join forces with other World Organizations

The mission of this Commission is to collaborate with federalist organizations and other entities worldwide to promote the World Constitution of the Earth Federation and to reach agreements based on the overall PWP Work Programme.

Specifically, this Commission will advocate for a UN Conference of Nations (in accordance with Article 109 of its Charter) in coordination with the Ratification Commission on this issue.

This Commission has only met through its delegation ad hoc for article 109. It has created some important documents on this topic, and its Special Envoy meets, this July, with the 109 Coalition Organization in New York and afterwards go on traveling to visit the Irish President.

13. World Commission for Healthy Living and Sport

Its main function is to promote healthy living within a global culture of peace and fraternity among all the peoples of the planet through knowledge-sharing activities on healthy eating habits from diverse cultures, based on both traditional and scientific knowledge.

This Commission has met once till now.

14. Youth Committee

The Youth Committee was created to ensure the participation of young people in global governance, in decision-making processes, and in building the common future of humanity.

This Commission meets once a month without a fixed day.

15. Education Committee

The Education Committee has a mission to develop and promote global educational policies and frameworks that support global citizenship, peace, sustainability, democratic governance, and the evolution of human consciousness.

This Commission meets once a month without a fixed day.

16. Global Council for the Development of Consciousness

Its mission is to promote the study and development of higher levels of consciousness as a fundamental condition for world peace, planetary governance, sustainability, and the ethical use of power and technology.

This Commission is pending to meet.

17. Finance Commission

The Finance Committee is mandated to ensure the financial integrity, transparency, sustainability, and accountability of all financial activities of the Provisional World Parliament and its related administrative bodies.

It has not yet commenced its activities.

18. World Parliament University

In Pondicherry, the drafting of a Charter of Principles with detailed content for its operation was announced.

It has not yet commenced its activities.

Territorial Delegations:

Its objective is to promote widespread participation of people from different geographical areas in coordination with the Ratification Commission.

It has not yet commenced its activities.
