



COLLEGE OF JUDGES

*Bearing in mind the upcoming 5th Constituent Assembly,
Moving towards the First Operational Stage outlined in the Earth Constitution,
And with the impetus of the 16th Session of the Provisional World Parliament (PWP) held
in December 2025 in Pondicherry, India, each Administration, Committee, and
Commission is framed within the work plan of the Provisional World Parliament.*

1. Legal basis and purpose

The College of Judges was activated at the 16th Session of the Provisional World Parliament (December 2025), in accordance with Article 9, "The World Judiciary" of the World Constitution, specifically Section 9.4, which establishes "The College of World Judges."

Currently, we have a first College of Judges that will be able to act as a provisional planetary advisory body, guaranteeing the interpretation, safeguarding, and preliminary application of the principles of the Earth Constitution during the Provisional Stage of World Governance. It also serves as a body within the justice system in development, that contributes to the germinal establishment of the structures that will operationalize the new planetary justice system, which core is the consolidation of an independent and impartial World Judiciary that effectively controls arbitrary and abusive practices of the Law on a planetary scale. As we progress through the operational stages of the World Constitution, the College will be able to enlarge as needed, without exceeding sixty members. Furthermore, according to Article 9.4.3. the term of office for a World Judge will be 10 years, but he may serve in successive terms without limit.

2. Status and nature

2.1. The College of Judges is an advisory body and in development of the planetary justice system within the framework of the Provisional World Government.

2.2. It operates with independence and impartiality in its legal reasoning. There is voluntary institutional responsibility before the Provisional World Parliament and disciplinary responsibility for misconduct before the Presidium, subject to prior majority agreement of the College of Judges.

2.3. In the near future, the College's World Judges will be nominated by the House of Councillors and must be elected by a plurality of votes from the three Chambers of the World Parliament in joint session.

World Jurisdiction and the mandate granted to the College of Judges will be completed with the future establishment of the World Benches envisaged and defined constitutionally in the twelve paragraphs of Article 9.4 of the World Constitution. As a matter of fact, the Council of World Judges within the College of Judges will elect and assign all World Judges, including themselves, to the several Benches of the World Supreme Court.

3. Mission and objectives

The mission of the College of Judges is:

- To protect and defend the civil and human rights guaranteed in the World Constitution and its World Laws;
 - To ensure constitutional legality and justice in all areas, especially the protection of fundamental rights and the legal order of International Law related to the World Constitution and its Legislation;
 - Provide authoritative legal interpretations when requested by the Presidium, the Permanent Secretariat, and the Provisional World Parliament. Also provide such interpretations when requested by Administrations, Commissions, and Committees of the World Constitution for the Earth Federation;
 - Likewise, the College of Judges may provide authoritative legal interpretations to those collaborating or sympathetic organizations of the Earth Federation that so request.

4. Scope of competence

The College's competencies include:

4.1 **Dissemination and Promotion**

- Spreading of the content of the World Constitution;
- Promotion of the "meta-normative culture" around the full application of the World Constitution for a global cultural transformation and formation of the structures of the planetary justice system.

4.2 **Interpretive and consultative functions in the legal field**

- Interpretation of the provisions of the Constitution and its Laws;
- Release of legal opinions on legal matters.

4.3 Legislative Review

- Review of World Legislative Acts regarding their constitutional consistency;
- Recommendations relating to regulatory compliance or review.

4.4 Ethics and judicial standards

- Ethical conduct, transparency and judicial independence;
 - Observance of the highest standards in the protection of fundamental, human, civil, social and environmental rights, in all judicial matters that may arise.

5. Functions

The College of Judges must:

- To disseminate the content of the World Constitution to the international legal community, especially to judges around the world with the aim of increasing membership in the College and forming the Courts of the World Supreme Court, as well as to the international legal academic community, promoting a mutation of the meta-normative culture that prepares the full application of the World Constitution by the Courts of Justice;
 - To contribute to the formation of the structures of the planetary justice system (the World Prosecutors' Office, the World Police and the body of World Ombudsmus);
 - Issue legal interpretations at the request of Parliament and its bodies;
 - Supervise and support the Legislative Review Commission;
 - Contribute to the development of planetary Jurisprudence.

6. Composition and appointments

6.1. The current College of Judges is composed of the judges elected and confirmed by the Provisional World Parliament at its 16th Session.

6.2. The judges are selected based on:

- His legal experience and his recognized engagement to the World Constitution for the Earth Federation;
 - Their human integrity and independence;
 - Their commitment to planetary justice in all its fields.

7. Presidency, internal coordination and composition

7.1. The College of Judges may elect a President Judge from among its members.

7.2. The internal procedures for access to new members are established by the College itself and in accordance with the World Constitution, especially in its Article 9.

8. Independence, Impartiality and Responsibility

8.1. Judges act independently and impartially.

8.2. The Judges of the College are accountable to the Presidium, the Permanent Secretariat, and the Provisional World Parliament through voluntary periodic reports. Disciplinary proceedings for misconduct may only be initiated by a majority vote of the College of Judges following a decision by the Presidium.

8.3. Judicial immunity will apply within the scope of official functions.

9. Transitional function of the College of Judges

The College acts as a bridge institution towards the College of World Judges provided for in Article 9 of the Constitution, as well as towards the establishment of the Specialized Courts and the Planetary Supreme Court provided for in the World Constitution when it is fully ratified, fulfilling the development of the consecutive operational stages of the Earth Federation.

10. Entry into force

This document will enter into force in February 2026 following its approval by the College of Judges and its acceptance by the Presidium, the Permanent Secretariat, and the Provisional World Parliament.

This foundational document is subject to further updates by the College of Judges to ensure its maximum effectiveness.
