



# COMMISSION FOR PEACE AND DISARMAMENT

*Bearing in mind the upcoming 5th Constituent Assembly,  
Moving towards the First Operational Stage outlined in the Earth Constitution,  
And with the impetus of the 16th Session of the Provisional World Parliament (PWP) held  
in December 2025 in Pondicherry, India, each Administration, Committee, and  
Commission is framed within the work plan of the Provisional World Parliament*

## 1. Legal basis and purpose

The World Commission on Peace and Disarmament is created with the approval of the Provisional World Parliament in accordance with the World Constitution (Art. 19) and the World Law 75 adopted during the 16th Session of the Provisional World Parliament.

The Commission has the mission of promoting and achieving planetary peace and security, demilitarization, non-violence and the progressive elimination of war as an instrument in human relations, in accordance with the first article of the World Constitution of the Earth Federation.

## 2. Status and nature

2.1. The Commission is a strategic, regulatory and advisory body.

2.2. It operates in coordination with the Provisional World Parliament and contributes with its proposals and initiatives.

2.3. This Commission does not command military forces nor does it exercise any coercive power.

## 3. Mission and objectives

- To advance global peace and human security;
  - To achieve disarmament and the conversion of military economies to civilian economies;
  - Support the peaceful resolution of conflicts and reconciliation.

## 4. Scope of competence

### 4.1 Disarmament and reduction of armaments

- Promotion of nuclear, chemical and biological disarmament;

- Progressive reduction of conventional armaments and military spending;
- Support for initiatives to convert armaments into useful materials.

#### 4.2 **Peacebuilding and conflict prevention**

- Early warning of conflict risks;
- Support for mediation, dialogue and reconciliation processes;
- Promotion of non-violent methods for conflict resolution.

#### 4.3 **Demilitarization of global governance**

- Elimination of war and armies;
  - Development of frameworks for planetary security without militarism.

### 5. Functions

The Commission will promote:

- Global Legislative Acts aimed at peace and disarmament;
- Monitoring and preventing militaristic tendencies;
- Peace education and public awareness;
- Cooperation with regional and international peace initiatives.

In turn, the Commission will promote studies on:

- International Relations;
  - Conflict resolution;
  - Security and disarmament policies.

### 6. Those responsible for the Peace and Disarmament Commission

6.1. The person responsible for the Commission is elected or confirmed by the Provisional World Parliament.

6.2 The Commission is composed of members and collaborators who freely join and are accepted by the responsible person if there are no objections.

6.3 The responsible person will:

- design the strategies for peace initiatives;
  - exercise the representation before Parliament and external partners;
  - submit bimonthly reports to the Presidium and the Permanent Secretariat on the progress made and challenges encountered during that period, as well as plans and projects developed.

### 7. Coordination and cooperation

The Commission cooperates mainly with:

- The Legislative Review Commission;
  - The Earth Emergency Rescue Administration (EERA);
  - The Education and Youth Committees;
  - International peace organizations;

## 8. Ethical foundations

The Commission affirms that peace is a fundamental human right and that security must be based on cooperation, justice and a shared human destiny.

## 9. Entry into force

This document will enter into force in February 2026 following its approval by the own Peace and Disarmament Commission, the Presidium, and the Permanent Secretariat. It will remain valid until further update.
