



EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Bearing in mind the upcoming 5th Constituent Assembly, Moving towards the First Operational Stage outlined in the Earth Constitution, And with the impetus of the 16th Session of the Provisional World Parliament (PWP) held in December 2025 in Pondicherry, India, each Administration, Committee, and Commission is framed within the work plan of the Provisional World Parliament.

1. Legal basis and purpose

The Education Committee is created with the approval of the Provisional World Parliament in accordance with the World Constitution and World Law adopted during the 16th Session of the Provisional World Parliament (WLA73).

The Committee is tasked with developing and promoting global educational policies and frameworks that support global citizenship, peace, sustainability, democratic governance, and the evolution of human consciousness.

2. Status and nature

2.1. The Education Committee is a strategic, regulatory, and advisory body.

2.2. It operates in coordination with the Provisional World Parliament and contributes its proposals and initiatives.

2.3. It does not replace national education systems, but it works to improve them by promoting Comprehensive Cognitive Education.

3. Mission and objectives

The mission of the Education Committee is:

- To promote education as the foundation of planetary civilization encouraging understanding of the World Constitution for the Earth Federation;
 - Promote universal access to quality education at all levels;
 - Align education with the ethical, ecological, and social needs of humanity.
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4. Scope of competence

4.1 Planetary educational frameworks

- To publicize the World Constitution for the Earth Federation;
- Promoting education for global citizenship;
- Integration of peace, sustainability and human rights into education.
- Development of global educational principles and curriculum guidelines

4.2 Knowledge integration

- Promotion of Comprehensive Cognitive Education, focusing on the practice of Art and activities in accordance with respect for Nature and all sentient beings;
- Integration of scientific, cultural, spiritual and indigenous knowledge systems;
- Support for interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary learning.

4.3 Educational innovation

- Promotion of digital and hybrid learning models;
 - Support for open education and the knowledge commons.
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5. Functions

The Education Committee is accredited to:

- Propose educational policies and frameworks to Parliament;
 - Cooperate with educational institutions and networks;
 - Support teacher training and capacity building;
 - Prepare reports on the challenges and progress of global education.
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6. Presidency

6.1. The Chairperson for the Education Committee is elected or confirmed by the Provisional World Parliament.

6.2. The Chairperson is responsible for:

- Educational initiatives;
 - Representation before the Parliament and educational organizations;
 - Reporting on initiatives and results by submitting a report to the Presidium and the Permanent Secretariat at least every two months, detailing the activities, ideas, etc., that arose and were developed during that period.
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7. Composition and Working Structure

7.1. The Committee is composed by the members and collaborators, who join freely and are accepted by the Chairperson, if there are no objections.

7.2. Members may include experts in all educational areas.

7.3. The Committee may establish temporary or permanent working groups.

8. Coordination and cooperation

The Education Committee cooperates primarily with:

- The Youth Committee;
 - The World Parliament University;
 - The World Council for the Development of Consciousness;
 - The Commission for Peace and Disarmament.
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9 Ethical foundations

The Committee affirms that Education is a universal right and an essential pillar of global peace and democracy.

10. Entry into force

This document will come into effect in February 2026 following its approval by the own Education Committee, the Presidium, and the Permanent Secretariat. It will remain valid until further update.
