WORLD POPULATION AND MIGRATION COUNCIL

*Bearing in mind the holding of the upcoming 5th Constituent Assembly,
Moving towards the First Operational Stage indicated by the Constitution of the Earth,
And with the impetus of the 16th Session of the Provisional World Parliament (PWP) held
in December 2025 in Pondicherry, India, each Administration, Committee and
Commission is framed in the work plan of the Provisional World Parliament.*

1. Legal basis and role

The World Population and Migration Council is established with the approval of the Provisional World Parliament in accordance with the World Constitution and the World Law (WLA85) called "Global Framework Law on Population, Migration, and Social Sustainability" adopted during the 16th Session of the Provisional World Parliament in Pondicherry, India, December 2025.

The article 1 of this WLA85 establishes a common framework for demographic management, fair migration, social security, and planetary sustainability, at the local, national, and global levels, under the coordination of the Earth Federation and their competent administrative Departments.

2. Status and nature

This World Population and Migration Council is created:

2.1. Recognizing that current demographic changes -including population aging, declining birth rates in some regions, and accelerated growth in others- constitute an unprecedented global challenge.

2.2. Considering Human migration is a fundamental right and, at the same time, a tool for balancing populations and economies across regions.

2.3. Affirming that social justice, environmental sustainability, and global cooperation must guide humanity's demographic, economic and labor management.

2.4. The World Population and Migration Council is hereby established as an advisory body to the Earth Federation, in coordination with the Department of Population, the Department of Labor and Income, and the Department of Foreign Affairs.

3. Mission and objectives

In accordance with Article 3 of WLA85, we find the first interpretation and mission of this Council: since Migration is considered as a "Bridge", this Council is inviting the Member States to be adopted a Regulated and Fair Migration System, in coordination with the Departments of Population, Human Rights, and Distributive Justice, based on these main objectives:

- Recognition of migration as a human right;
 - Balance between regions with labor shortages and regions with young populations;
 - Prevention of humanitarian crises through international cooperation.

4. Scope of competences of this Council

4.1 Economy and Labor (Article 4. WLA85)

In coordination with the Departments of Labor and Income, Economic and Social Development, Trade and Industry, and Science and Technology:

1. The creation of a Planetary Basic Income, financed by the Global Fund for Social Justice, is established as a progressive goal.
2. States and regions must implement labor retraining plans in emerging sectors, such as: new technologies, renewable energy, health and care, and sustainable agroecological production.

4.2. Health and Aging (Article 5. WLA85)

In coordination with the Departments of Health and Nutrition, Science and Technology, and Genetic Research and Engineering:

The Global Fund for Social Security and Health is established to:

- Support social security systems in regions affected by population aging;
- Finance research in biotechnology and preventive medicine;
- Guarantee universal access to long-term care.

4.3. Climate Change and Consumption (Article 6. WLA85)

In coordination with the Departments of Environment and Ecology, Energy, Food and Agriculture, Atmosphere and Space, and Global Resources:

1. Population reduction must be linked to a new model of sustainable consumption.
2. States and regions must:
 - Promote clean energy;
 - Promote efficient and sustainable food production;
 - Adopt plans to progressively reduce fossil fuel consumption and over consumption patterns.

4.4. **New order of global cooperation** (Article 7. WLA85)

In coordination with the Departments of Foreign Affairs, Democratic Procedures, Distributive Justice, and Human Rights:

1. The objective of overcoming the logic of geopolitical blocs (North-South) and building a fully functioning Democratic World Parliament is reaffirmed.
2. The redistribution of resources and long-term policies must be based on:
 - Global cooperation;
 - Social and environmental justice;
 - Balance between population, resources, and sustainability.

4.5. **Multi-Level Implementation** (Article 8. WLA85)

In coordination with the World Service Corps and all relevant Administrative Departments, the World Population and Migration Council will come to be a guarantor in order to this WLA 85 will be implemented at three levels:

- Local: Communities and municipalities will adopt migration, health, and sustainability plans adapted to their circumstances;
- National: Member States will implement demographic, labor, and sustainable consumption policies in accordance with this Law;
- Global: The Earth Federation will coordinate, oversee, and provide global coherence to the policies established in the preceding articles.

5. **Functions** (Article 2. WLA85)

The World Population and Migration Council has primarily these functions:

- Design demographic balance policies that respect reproductive rights;
- Assist countries with low birth rates, an aging population, or an excess of young people;
- Coordinate workforce redistribution plans among regions.

6. **Presidency, coordination and responsibilities**

6.1. The Chairperson of this World Population and Migration Council has been elected by the Provisional World Parliament.

6.2. This Council mainly coordinates with the Departments mentioned in the scope of competences. It also coordinates all activities in accordance with objectives.

6.3. The College is accountable to the Presidium, the Permanent Secretariat, and the Provisional World Parliament through periodic reports.

6.4. Even previously to the First Operational Stage of the Earth Federation, the Chairperson of this Council is responsible for:

- Convening the sessions of work with its team;
 - Leading the necessary preparatory process in accordance with the objectives mentioned in WLA 85 and repeated in this Document.

7. Composition and experience

7.1. The World Population and Migration Council is made up of members and collaborators who freely join and are accepted by the Chairperson if there are no objections.

7.2. The members volunteers for this Council are self-organizing and independent; persons committed to justice, ethical values, and human dignity, as well as the main achieving objective of a Democratic Earth Federation in mind, in which all cultural diversity of the Regions of the World will be respected.

7.3. Experience of members may comprise:

- Knowledge of Labor and Income regulations, Economic and Social Development, Trade and Industry, Science and Technology (new technology, renewable energy, sustainable agroecological production);
- Social and environmental justice knowledges;
- Comparative governance systems, democratic procedures, and International Law knowledges in all areas, etc.

8. Entry into force

As WLA85 shall enter into force immediately during the First Operational Stage, serving as a guiding framework, and shall be fully binding in subsequent stages of consolidation of the Earth Federation.

This Base document for this The World Population and Migration Council will enter into force in February 2026 following its acceptance by the Council itself, the Presidium, the Permanent Secretariat, and the Provisional World Parliament. It will remain valid until further update.
