



YOUTH COMMITTEE

*Bearing in mind the upcoming 5th Constituent Assembly,
Moving towards the First Operational Stage outlined in the Earth Constitution,
And with the impetus of the 16th Session of the Provisional World Parliament (PWP) held
in December 2025 in Pondicherry, India, each Administration, Committee, and
Commission is framed within the work plan of the Provisional World Parliament*

1. Legal basis and purpose

The Youth Committee is created with the approval of the Provisional World Parliament in accordance with the World Constitution and World Law (WLA75) passed during the 16th Session of the Provisional World Parliament.

The Committee's role is to ensure the participation of young people in global governance, in decision-making processes, and in building the common future of Humanity.

2. Status and nature

2.1. The Youth Committee is a representative, consultative and participatory body.

2.2. It operates in coordination with the Provisional World Parliament and contributes with its proposals and initiatives.

3. Mission and objectives

- To engage young people worldwide in learning about the World Constitution of the Earth Federation and its values;
 - To give voice to the world's youth to protect their rights and interests;
 - Empowering young people as co-creators of planetary solutions;
 - Promote intergenerational justice and shared responsibility.
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4. Scope of competence

4.1. Youth participation in global governance

- In consultations, referendums and any other parliamentary processes;
- Developing mechanisms for consultations, forums and youth dialogues;

- Promotion of youth representation in any Committees, Commissions and Administrations of the Provisional World Parliament.

4.2. **Education, employment and skills**

- Promotion of Comprehensive Cognitive Education, emphasizing the practice of Arts and activities in accordance with respect for Nature and all sentient beings;
- Promotion of decent and creative work, leveraging research and technology for current and future innovations;
- Support for initiatives and ventures led by youth.

4.3. **Culture, media and digital life**

- Participation in all cultural and digital environments, maximizing respect for youth;
 - Promotion of an ethical digital culture, and physical and mental well-being.
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5. Functions

The Youth Committee is accredited to:

- Submit recommendations and proposals to Parliament;
 - Organize youth forums, assemblies and dialogues;
 - Cooperate with local, national and international educational and cultural institutions;
 - Support global ethical youth networks.
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6. Those responsible for the Youth Committee

6.1. The person responsible for the Education Committee is elected or confirmed by the Presidium and/or the Provisional World Parliament.

6.2. As the Committee evolves, its composition will reflect a growing diversity of young people from different regions, cultures, and social backgrounds.

The Committee is composed of members and collaborators, who freely join and are accepted by the person responsible, if there are no objections.

6.3. The responsible person will:

- Coordinate the activities of the Committee;
 - Report on initiatives and results by sending a report every two months to the Presidium and the Permanent Secretariat with the activities, ideas, etc., that arose and were developed during that period.
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7. Coordination and cooperation

The Youth Committee cooperates especially with:

- The Education Committee;
 - The World Parliament University;
 - The World Council for the Development of Consciousness.
 - The Commission for Peace and Disarmament.
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8. Ethical foundations

Youth is not only a hope for future, but an active part of the present of planetary governance.

9. Entry into force

This document will come into effect in February 2026 following its approval by the own Youth Committee, the Presidium, and the Permanent Secretariat. It will remain valid until further update.
