Minutes of the 11st meeting of the Ratification Commission held via
Zoom on Tuesday 4th July, 2026

Attendees: Nelly Castro, Julio Mas, and Chema Tejederas.
Francisco Plancarte, Rudolf Schmitz-Perrin, Manuel Galiñanes y Alicia de los
Ángeles Roda justified their absence by saying they were unable to attend.

Summary

The meeting focused on the difficulties in disseminating the World Constitution, especially due to the website's delays. **Julio** and **Nelly** shared personal experiences, the situation in Venezuela after the earthquake, and the consequences of global warming. They criticized the influence of the United States, the situation in Latin America, the ineffectiveness of the UN, and our commitment to its transformation through the activation of Article 109. **Nelly** reported on the dissemination work in Venezuela, particularly with justices of the peace and communities, and emphasized the importance of involving new generations. The meeting had a reflective and emotional tone, with concerns about the future of the project and the need for continuity.

Nelly reported on the earthquake situation in Venezuela, mentioning that, despite the losses and damage, the response from Venezuelans and international aid was effective, and that the government is beginning the construction of housing. **Julio** commented on a recent, less intense earthquake in Granada, Spain, which has caused temporary evacuations.

The participants discussed the situation of Nicolás Maduro and the widespread abuse and inaction. **Julio** explained that the United States has placed Maduro under the jurisdiction of the American justice system, which could further delay the situation, and it was mentioned that the United States has intervened in several countries in the region, including instigating coups and assassinating presidents. **Nelly** praised Claudia Sheinbaum for not being afraid and seeking support from Putin when she faced tariffs. The conversation continued, accusing the United States of its determination to control strategic areas such as the Strait of Hormuz and the Strait of Gibraltar, and of supporting Morocco with arms sales in the conflict with Spain over Ceuta as a follow-up to the "cession" of Western Sahara.

Julio and **Chema** also discussed the limitations of the UN and the International Criminal Court in this context, concluding that the situation reflects a world in which the law of the strongest prevails.

Chema expressed concern about the website's effectiveness, arguing that it is currently neither attractive nor intuitive for new users and that it could reduce the chances of achieving the growth objectives, which are the responsibility of this Ratification Commission. **Julio** indicated that the website needs a professional to improve it, but the conversation ended without a clear resolution on the matter.

The group then focused on Article 109 as a key avenue for reforming the UN Charter, with Julio expressing his preference for this approach. **Chema** mentioned that other organizations are vying for the same goal, including one called "Article 109," which has the support of prominent figures such as Mary Robinson and the current President of Ireland.

Regarding climate change, **Julio** and **Chema** discussed its future impacts, mentioning that temperatures are predicted to reach 50 degrees, which will result in serious consequences for biodiversity, the global economy, and humanity as a whole, highlighting the lack of political action to address effective solutions.

Nelly explained that **Leopoldo** and other colleagues are organizing meetings with justices of the peace in Venezuela to promote the values of the World Constitution, emphasizing the importance of respectful dialogue and working towards building a better society for future generations. **Nelly** described how justices of the peace are nationally trained legal professionals who help resolve community issues in communal councils and communes, and stressed the need for youth participation in the organization.

The meeting concluded with Chema reminding everyone that the Commission's objective is to disseminate knowledge of the Constitution, primarily through its website.
